This program is for you if you want to deepen your relationship:

- ~ With God;
- ~ With the poor;
- ~ In a supportive environment of fellow learners

This program is for you if you want to explore meaningful questions, such as:

- ~ How can God shape me through the poor?
- ~ In what ways am I homeless, imprisoned, and impoverished?
- ~ What currently keeps me separated from persons in poverty?
- ~ Other questions you and God will identify.

No specific credentials or background are required to participate in this program.

When:

- ~ Six, two hour sessions (teaching and small group support)
- ~ Plus: one full day inner city pilgrimage

Dates:

- ~ Tuesdays, February 12 & 26, March 11, and April 1, 15, & 29 (7 to 9 p.m.)
- ~ Saturday, March 15 for pilgrimage (Saturday before Holy Week)

Location:

Expectations:

- ~ Be in at least one relationship with a person on the margins (with support from City House)
- ~ Pray for ½ hour per day, with reflection on selected saints and writers
- ~ Two reflection assignments
